How Hill Day Visits

We have lots of fantastic options for visits. We offer a range of activities, the most popular include:

Pond Dipping- Getting up close to the creatures that live in our dykes. **Nature Trail**- A walk around the reserve looking at several different habitats and thinking about the plants and animals that live there.

Toad Hole Cottage Museum- Children step back in time when they go into our Victorian marshman's cottage.

Thatching - A hands on experience giving children a chance to work together and get to grips with this traditional craft.

Environmental Art - Getting creative and making woodland masterpieces.

Hawks and Blackbirds - A dynamic educational food chain game giving children a clear understanding of food chains and predator-prey relationships.

Day visits usually run from 10am-2pm with a short lunch break. Three activities are included and a



standard programme is as follows:
